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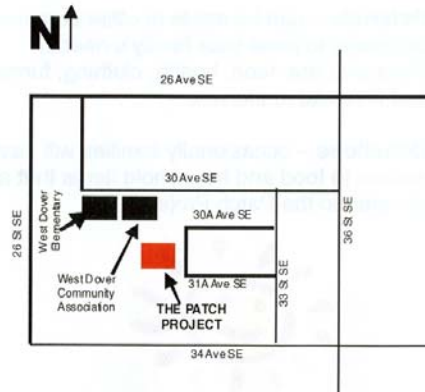

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What is the Patch Project ?

The Patch Project is a Hull Child and Family Services Program. The mandate of the project is to offer support, advocacy, information and referrals to families living in the Lawnview apartments and the Dover community.

Many of our programs are offered in partnership with other community agencies including Calgary Housing Company, Alexandra Community Health Centre and the Devar Child Care Society.

With a strong focus on community development and improving access to resources, the Patch Project strives to assist residents in achieving and maintaining healthy lifestyles and a positive quality of life.

On-site Community and Family Facilitators develop and implement programs according to the changing needs and goals of the community.

The Patch Project team is here as a part of the community. We are available to support and work with children and families to address issues that may be negatively impacting their emotional, physical and spiritual health.



This program is voluntary. We encourage and welcome your involvement. Stop by for a coffee or a visit during our hours of operation and help us explore how we can work together.



Services We Can Offer:

The Patch Project's Community and Family Facilitators offer ongoing support to families in a variety of ways:

- **Family Support** – help families minimize stressors such as: health, parenting, employment, budgeting and isolation issues.
- **Advocacy** – assist families in working with larger systems, such as Social Assistance, AISH and other government services.
- **Referrals** – can be made to other community programs to meet your family's needs. Examples are: food, health, clothing, furniture and financial resources.
- **Donations** – occasionally families will have access to food and household items that are donated to the Patch Project.



Direct Programming:

In addition to direct family support, we offer a variety of programs and services.

- **Counselling** – Counsellors from the Alexandra Community Health Centre are available to provide free counselling to individuals, couples and families for a number of issues including: depression, anxiety, relationship issues, anger and stress management and child-parent issues.
- **Adult Education** – our Education Facilitator assists adults in many areas: ESL preparation, academic upgrading or GED, basic literacy, returning to school and homework strategies for parents (to help their children with school work).
- **Employment** – our Employment Facilitator supports youth and adults with: job search strategies, resumes, cover letters, interview preparation and follow-up.
- **Computer Lab** – our on-site computer labs are available for various purposes such as: job search, resume writing, homework, internet research or e-mail.
- **Recreation** – we work with community agencies to improve access to a variety of recreation programs and offer additional activities for children and families.

Individuals or families are welcome to volunteer with the Patch Project to share their time and skills
