Bursary Information

Training Division Fire Academy is offering a \$250.00 CAD bursary to any High School student graduating in 2018 in the province of Alberta who is looking to take Training Divisions Basic Fire Academy. Training Division provides the most flexible, part time option to get your NFPA 1001: Firefighter Level I & II, and NFPA 472: Hazmat Operations and Awareness certification. Our graduates can apply throughout Canada and the US and have gained employment in almost every major Canadian city.

Below we have provided each school with a link that the student can register through. By using that link the student will be granted their bursary discount automatically and the referring school will receive a \$250.00 bursary. This can be used for school supplies or athletic supplies as desired.

The Basic Fire Academy program has the theory portion of the program delivered online which includes a series of videos and online exams. Once the online portion is complete, students can book their boot camp component. Here they get to come live at our Fire Hall for 14 days where all of the training, eating, sleeping, and testing takes place. This bootcamp is followed by the Texas Commissions on Fire Protection delivering the final testing for the official certificates. Everything outside of books, flights to the area of your chosen bootcamp, a pair of black boots and navy pants are included in the tuition.

We will be in Calgary and holding an open house at the Heritage Point Fire Hall on April 26th and 27th from 10:00am - 2:00pm.

This is a live Fire Hall so you must pre book your Tour with our Recruitment Officer.

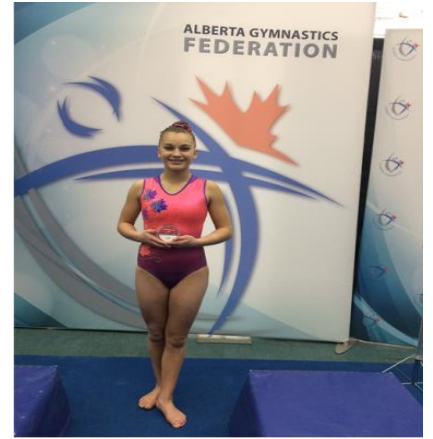
