Overall results have always been very high, however some improvement has been seen in the number of graduates pursuing post-secondary within 6 years of completing high school.

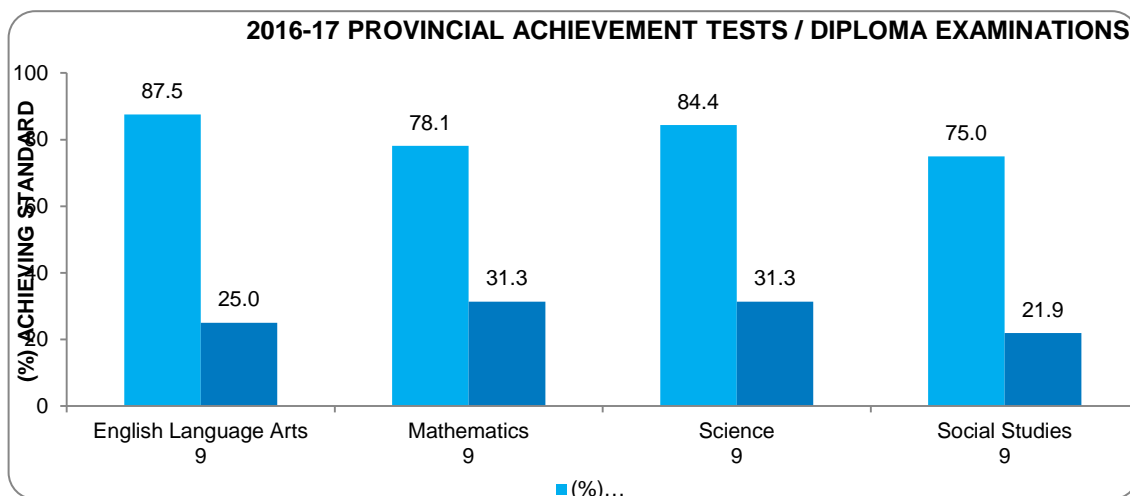
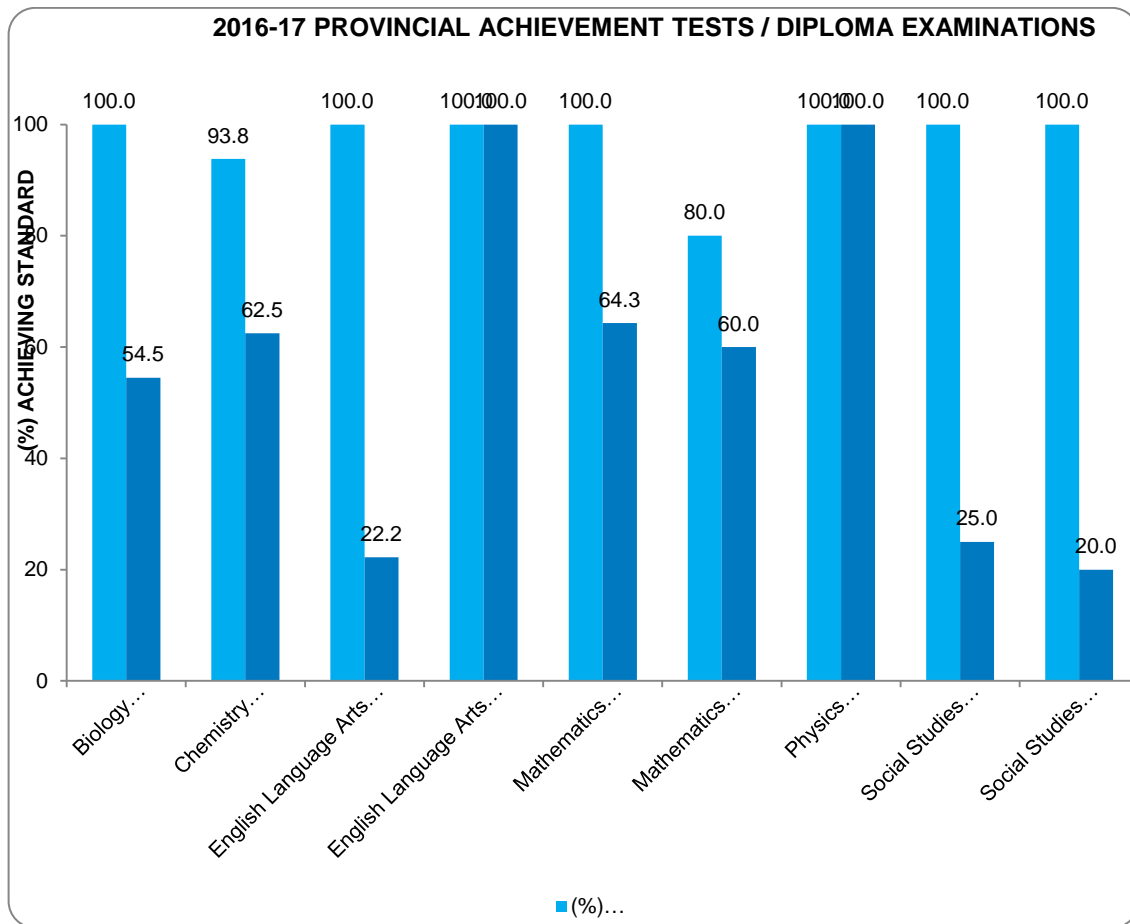
Declines
