Students also have the capacity to enhance their online education through hands-on-learning opportunities at the Career and Technology Centre. Many students are able to complete academic courses in an online setting, while learning valuable skills and trades – all under the same roof.

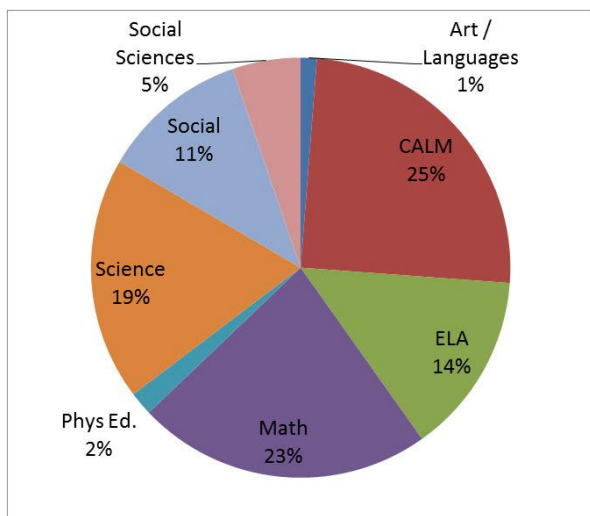
CBe-learn School Overview

In addition to class-based assessments, each year, our school administers provincial achievement tests to Grade 9 students, and Diploma Exams to Grade 12 students.

The purpose of the testing program is to:

- determine whether students are learning what they are expected to learn;
- report to Albertans how well students have achieved provincial standards; and
- assist schools, authorities, and the province in monitoring and improving student learning.

The results from the testing are only one aspect of student achievement in the CBE. In addition to academics, we consider the overall success of students, which includes the ways they demonstrate citizenship, character and personal development.

school development plan 2013-2014

Theory of Action:

If we focus resources and time to developing teachers' capacity to design authentic, personalized, inquiry based tasks and assessments, then students will be more intellectually engaged and self-motivated and academic performance will improve.

Instructional Actions:

- Galileo Network will support four High School academic core teachers team at system leadership meetings which will focus on designing tasks based on the TEF
- PD days will focus on strategies to assist with Task Design and Assessment
- Teachers collaborating in teams
- In Social Studies, teachers will offer optional student choice real-world opportunities to develop and apply their understanding of Social Studies Concepts.
- In English Language Arts, teachers will focus on learning strategies to promote self-regulation and metacognition.
- In CALM, teachers will develop more relevant and authentic assessment.
- In Science, teachers will attempt to make students more comfortable through increased communication and conceptual videos in an effort to make the transition to online learning more seamless.
- In Math, teachers will focus on strategies to build, create, utilize, improve and enhance feedback for students.
- The Junior High team will collaborate to design one cross-curricular project.

- International students writing Diploma Exams are assessed a \$50 fee from Alberta Education. This is payable directly to CBe-learn.
