We would like to invite your Grade 9 student to CBE's Career and Technology Centre "Try a Trade" event on the afternoon of Thursday, November 15th. Students are asked to pre-select two activities from the following:

- **Halloween Party**

**You are invited to Windsor Park's Halloween Party on Thursday, October 25<sup>th</sup> from 3:15 to 5:00 pm at Windsor Park school.**

Students and their families are invited to wear costumes to the party. Please note that costumes are not to be worn in classes. Please do not bring toy weapons – please check with your teacher facilitator or admin if you wish to bring a toy weapon as part of your costume. Roving teachers will be judging the costumes and awards will be given at the end of the party.

Please bring a potluck item to share with everybody. No peanuts or tree nuts (including peanut butter or almond flour). Veggies, fruits, meta and cheese, or simple snacks like cookies are encouraged. Please include the label or a list of ingredients beside your food. There will be a separate area for allergen free foods (gluten-free, dairy-free, egg-free) and vegetarian or vegan dishes.

Students are invited to bring a decorated pumpkin for the jack-o'-lantern contest. You can get your pumpkin number from the front door table, stick it on your pumpkin, and then place it on the edge of the stage for judging. Everyone will be given ballots with which to vote for their favourite jack-o'-lanterns. Prizes will be awarded at the end of the party.

There will be a number of activities for families to participate in at the school including a student run haunted house, competitions, crafts, food and places to eat and visit.

The haunted house has three scare levels:

1. Least scary. No startling from "scare-ers". Lights are on. We won't try to scare you.
2. Lights are dim. Some scaring and startling.
3. Lighting is very dim. Loud. As scary as possible.

Students in grades 3 or younger MUST try the haunted house at level 1 before trying level 2 or 3 unless they have parental permission. \*Parents have veto power over scare levels their children get to try.\* Please stay a few minutes after the party to help us take down decorations, pack up the potluck, and do a quick clean-up. Families are invited to arrive after lunch to help set up before the party too.
